A bit of context



- Small, independent liberal arts college established in 1885
- Archives established 1933
- Mission: to "assemble, preserve, and make accessible the official records of Rollins College and its special, historical collections."
- Systematic acquisition of electronic records (defined broadly) began in 2010
- Digital archivist hired 2013
- College website redesign 2013-2014

Why preserve websites and web content?

"The average lifespan of a Web page today is 100 days. This is no way to run a culture."

(Brewster Kahle, quoted in 2003)

"Unfortunately and disturbingly, the Supreme Court appears to have a vast problem with 'link rot'... We found an alarmingly high number of websites cited by the Supreme Court that are no longer working, almost one-third (29%) of the time."

(Liebler and Liebert, 2013)



Web archiving program components




- Appraisal and selection

The technical piece: homegrown or vendor?


- We opted to work with a vendor because:

Policy development (September 2013)

- Program goals
 - “Through its Web Archiving Program, Olin Library selects, captures, describes, preserves, and makes accessible the historic web presence of Rollins College. Its purpose is to support records management and to document the history of the College.”
- Collecting scope
- Preservation and access measures

Policy development (September 2013)

- Collecting scope:
 - Administrative units
 - All academic units and the departments within
 - Student support units
 - Important cultural and artistic endeavors of the College
 - Athletics
 - College publications
 - Social networking sites maintained by specific College units

Policy development (September 2013)

- Left open the possibility of thematic collections that support the curriculum and/or complement existing special collections:

“As the Web Archiving Program develops, the Library may explore the addition of the websites of affiliated organizations (e.g., the Bach Festival Choir and the Genius Preserve), local organizations (e.g., the Hannibal Square Heritage Center), thematic collections that support the curriculum, and websites that complement existing archives and special collections.”

Organization & description (November 2013-present)

- Campus Publications (November 2013)
- Rollins College (December 2013)
 - One large collection or individual units?
- Course Catalogues and Schedules (March 2014)
- Apopka Farmworkers Collection (March 2014)
 - First thematic collection, complements existing special collection
